6650 SCHOLARSHIP FUND GIFTS

In order to administer special funds bequeathed to this district for scholarship purposes, the Board of Education requires each—such funds gifts to be deposited in a—separate interest-bearing bank account. carrying the name of the fund. The accounting for various scholarship gifts shall include separation of the gifts into individual scholarship funds within the same bank account. Accounting practices shall be the same as for any other account created under Policy 6660 and in accord with practices and procedures proscribed by the Business Office. The fund shall be maintained by the Director of School Counseling.

The School Business Administrator/Board Secretary/ or Assistant School Business Administrator/Assistant Board Secretary is authorized to obtain interest for each scholarship fund at a reasonable interest rate the fixed bank rate on such terms as may seem to him/her advisable and to make, execute, and deliver all instruments of assignment and transfer. Any interest derived from this account shall first reimburse the Board of Education for funds expended in maintaining or administering the account. Any leftover interest shall thereafter be distributed to each scholarship fund in a reasonable manner proscribed by the Business Administrator/Board Secretary.

Disbursements from a scholarship fund shall be made by the Director of Counseling in accordance with a schedule having the prior approval of the Board.

Funds are eligible to be maintained in the Scholarship Fund if they are provided to the Board of Education in accordance with Policy 7230. At the time of donation, the donor must designate criteria for selecting scholarship recipients, the goal of the specific scholarship, and expected duration of the scholarship. The donor retains the option to select scholarship recipients. Once a donor makes a gift in accordance with Policy 7230 for the purpose of awarding scholarships, funds cannot be returned to the donor without approval of the Board of Education.

If the scholarship is to be made available for more than one year, the donor must specify the mechanism for awarding scholarships in future years and a funding schedule if subsequent funding will be needed. After one school year where the donor has either failed to select a candidate to receive the scholarship or failed to respond to inquiries, the specific scholarship fund shall be considered defunct if funds have previously been donated and remain in the Board of Education's possession.

When a scholarship fund has been classified as defunct, one final attempt shall be made to contact the donor. If contact is not able to be made with the donor, or the donor fails to provide adequate direction for continued awarding of a scholarship, the Director of School Counseling shall thereafter take steps to eliminate the defunct fund.

To eliminate a defunct fund, the Director of School Counseling shall first attempt to award the scholarship according to the donor's prior criteria to the extent possible. If utilizing the original criteria is not possible, the Director of School Counseling shall award the remaining funds in a scholarship using the following minimum criteria: (1) academic success; and (2) a positive impact on the Randolph Township Schools community. Scholarships shall be awarded in the original amount of the scholarship gift until all funds have been distributed. When all funds have been distributed, the scholarship fund shall be eliminated.

6660 STUDENT ACTIVITY FUND

The Board of Education authorizes the establishment of a student activity account for funds derived from events and activities of pupil organizations and to account for the accumulation of money to pay for pupil group activities. The Board of Education may establish individual student activity accounts within a student activity account by Board resolution.

Student activity funds are maintained under the jurisdiction of the Board of Education and are under the supervision of the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-16.12(a), the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary designates the school Principal to administer the student activity account in each school building. Annually, the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall provide training to school Principals and present to the Board of Education a Student Activity Account Manual for adoption.

Funds collected for a student activity shall be turned into the Principal or designee and deposited in the bank within twenty-four forty-eight hours or a reasonable time thereafter the next school day after collection. Student activity funds shall be maintained in a secured and locked location prior to being deposited in the bank.

The student activity funds shall be maintained in an interest-bearing bank account separate from all other Board of Education funds. and shall be classified by school in the event only a single student activity account is established for all schools in the district. The interest earned shall be utilized to pay any expenses associated with maintaining the bank accounts, accounting, and maintenance. Any remaining funds shall be distributed to individual, active class funds in equal shares as of the first day of the next school year. disbursed to each individual student activity fund in proportion to the balances on deposit for each activity.

All student activity fund receipts shall be detailed and recorded by the individual student activity showing the date, source, purpose, and amount. The administrator of the student activity account shall provide a written receipt to the individual student activity advisor or coordinator when any student activity funds are turned in for deposit. A copy of these written receipts shall be maintained by the administrator of the student activity account and shall be traceable to the actual receipts or groups of receipts. All bank deposits shall agree with the copies of the written receipts for all deposits.

Requests to utilize funds from student activity funds shall be made on a purchase requisition form, and approved by the school Principal and either the School **Business** Administrator/Board **Secretary** or **Assistant** School **Business** Administrator/Assistant Board Secretary. All requests for disbursements from the student activity account shall be submitted to the school's administrator of the student activity account Disbursements for approved purchases shall only be made upon the approval of the school Principal and either School Business Administrator/Board Secretary or Assistant School Business Administrator/Assistant Board Secretary and must be supported upon a showing of by a claim, bill, invoice, or written order. All disbursements from the student activity account shall be recorded chronologically by school and individual student activity showing date, vendor, check number, purpose, and amount. All disbursements shall be made by check requiring at least two signatures as authorized and approved by Board of Education resolution.

The student activity account shall be reconciled with the student activity bank account on a monthly basis by the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary or their designee. and if the School Business Administrator designated an administrator of a student activity account, a copy of the reconciliation shall be submitted to the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary for review and approval. The bank account reconciliation shall be completed in accordance with the procedures and requirements established by the School Business Administrator/Board Secretary. Copies of canceled checks, bank statements, and bank account reconciliations shall be retained for examination by the licensed public school accountant as part of the annual audit required under N.J.S.A. 18A:23-1 et seq. and stated in N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-16.2(i).

Borrowing funds from any student activity account is prohibited. In addition, Tthe Board of Education shall not be responsible for the protection of and the accounting for funds collected by any teacher or pupil for an outside school organization in accordance with Policy 5830. In addition, the Board of Education shall not approve such funds for deposit in a student activity account.

Any funds accumulated in an individual student activity account that are unexpended or unallocated for use after the student activity is no longer active, discontinuance of the activity or a class has graduated shall revert to the school's activity accounts in the same manner as interest earned on the bank account is disbursed.

0169.02 BOARD MEMBER USE OF SOCIAL NETWORKS

In accordance with the School Ethics Act - N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21 et seq., Board of Education members must avoid conduct which is in violation of the public trust or which creates a justifiable impression among the public that such trust is being violated. To avoid conduct that may be in violation or perceived to be in violation of the School Ethics Act, the Board of Education adopts this Policy to provide guidance to Board members in their use of social networks.

For the purposes of this Policy, "social network(s)" shall include, but not be limited to: Internet blogs, electronic bulletin boards, social networking websites, or any other online platform where people may post or communicate interests, opinions, or any other information that may be viewed by others with or without permission from the person making such post or re-publishing such post. "Social networks" also means an Internet-based service that allows individuals to: construct a public or semi-public profile within a bounded system created by the service; create a list of other users with whom they share a connection within the system; and view and navigate their list of connections and those made by others within the system.

For the purposes of this Policy, "use of a social network" shall include, but not be limited to: posting to a social network, reposting another person's post to a social network, messaging, or any other publication of material on a social network.

Nothing in this Policy prevents a Board of Education member from using a social network. However, a Board member must avoid conduct on a social network that would violate the School Ethics Act – N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21 et seq., which includes the Code of Ethics for Board Members. Board members should be advised communications, publications, photographs, and any other information posted by the Board member or reposted by the Board member on a social network could violate the School Ethics Act and be cause for sanctions in accordance with the law.

While this Policy respects the right of Board members to use social networks, Board members shall recognize they are held to a higher standard than the general public with regard to standards of conduct and ethics. Board members who use social networks shall ensure their conduct is appropriate for a Board of Education member. Board members should exercise care in setting appropriate boundaries between their personal and public online behavior, understanding what is private in the digital world often has the possibility of becoming public, even without their knowledge or consent.

Board members should carefully review the privacy settings on social networks they use and exercise care and good judgment when posting content and information. When using social networks, Board members are advised to:

- 1. Not post anything that would violate any of the district's policies for Board members:
- 2. Uphold the district's value of respect for any individual(s) and avoid making defamatory statements about the Board of Education, the school district, employees, students, or their families;
- 3. Not disclose any confidential information about the school district or confidential information obtained as a result of being a Board member, about any individual(s) or organization, including students and/or their families:
- 4. Not disclose any inaccurate information about the Board of Education or the school district.
- 5. Not use or refer to their Board of Education title or position when soliciting for a business organization that he or she or any immediate family member has an interest in, as well as posting or referencing any confidential information regarding the Board of Education or the school district obtained through their Board membership, unless authorized by law;
- 6. Refrain from having communications through social networks with a majority of other Board members regarding any Board of Education business to avoid any potential violation of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act;
- 7. When responding to any postings or inquiries regarding Board of Education or school district business in which your opinions are being expressed, provide the appropriate disclaimer that those opinions are your own personal opinions and do not necessarily reflect the opinion of the Board as set forth in Bylaw 0146. Refer all complaints regarding the school district to the Superintendent of Schools to address, as appropriate;
- 8. Not post any information on a social network determined by the New Jersey School Ethics Commission to be a violation of the New Jersey School Ethics Act.

A Board member shall comply with all Board policies regarding acceptable use of computers and computer networks whenever a Board member is using a Board of Education electronic device.

If the Board or Superintendent believes a Board member's activity on any social network may violate the Board's policies or the New Jersey School Ethics Act, the Board or Superintendent may request the Board member cease such activity.

This Policy has been developed and adopted by this Board to provide guidance and direction to a Board member to avoid actual and/or a perceived appearance of inappropriate conduct or conduct prohibited by the School Ethics Act while using social networks.

2422 <u>HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u>

The Board of Education requires all students to participate in a comprehensive, sequential, health and physical education program aligned with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS) that emphasizes the natural interdisciplinary connection between wellness and health and physical education. The primary focus of the NJSLS is the development of knowledge and skills that influence healthy behaviors within the context of self, family, school, and the local and global community.

The NJSLS incorporate New Jersey statutes related to health and well-being of students in New Jersey schools. The following statutes incorporated into the NJSLS include, but are not limited to, the following requirements:

- 1. Accident and Fire Prevention (N.J.S.A. 18A:6-2) requires regular courses of instruction in accident and fire prevention.
- 2. Breast Self-Examination (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-5.4) requires offering instruction on breast self-examination for students in grades seven through twelve.
- 3. Bullying Prevention Programs (N.J.S.A. 18A:37-17) requires the establishment of bullying prevention programs.
- 4. Cancer Awareness (N.J.S.A. 18A:40-33) requires the development of a school program on cancer awareness by the Commissioner of Education.
- 5. Dating Violence Education (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.23a) requires instruction regarding dating violence in grades seven through twelve.
- 6. Domestic Violence Education (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.23) allows instruction on problems related to domestic violence and child abuse.
- 7. Gang Violence Prevention (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.26) requires instruction in gang violence prevention for elementary school students.
- 8. Health, Safety, and Physical Education (N.J.S.A. 18A:35) requires that all students in grades one through twelve participate in at least two and one-half hours of health, safety, and physical education each school week.

- 9. Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco, Controlled Dangerous Substances, and Anabolic Steroids (N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-1) requires instructional programs on drugs, alcohol, anabolic steroids, tobacco, and controlled dangerous substances and the development of curriculum guidelines for each grade Kindergarten through twelve.
- 10. Lyme Disease Prevention (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-5.1 through 5.3) requires the development of Lyme Disease curriculum guidelines and training to all teaching staff members who instruct students with Lyme Disease.
- 11. Organ Donation (N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-4.3) requires information relative to organ donation to be given to students in grades nine through twelve.
- 12. Sexual Assault Prevention (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.3) requires the development of a sexual assault prevention education program by the Commissioner of Education for utilization by school districts.
- 13. Stress Abstinence (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.19 through N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.22), also known as the "AIDS Prevention Act of 1999," requires sex education programs to stress abstinence.
- 14. Suicide Prevention (N.J.S.A. 18A:6-111 through 113) requires instruction in suicide prevention in public schools.
- 15. Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)/Automated External Defibrillator (AED) (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.28 and 18A:35-4.29) requires public high schools and charter schools to provide instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator to each student prior to graduation.
- 16. Sexually Explicit Images through Electronic Means (N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.32 and 4.33) requires instruction, once during middle school, on the social, emotional, and legal consequences of distributing and soliciting sexually explicit images through electronic means.
- 17. Other Statutory or Administrative Codes. The Board will incorporate into its health and physical education curriculum any other requirements of the NJSLS in Comprehensive Health and Physical Education.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.7, any student whose parent presents to the Principal a signed statement that any part of the instruction in health, family life education, or sex education is in conflict with his/her conscience or sincerely held moral or religious beliefs shall be excused from that portion of the course where such instruction is being given and no penalties as to credit or graduation shall result.

The Board of Education must provide two and one-half hours of health, safety, and physical education courses in each school week, or proportionately less when holidays fall within the week. Recess period(s) shall not be used to meet the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:35-5, 7, and 8.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:35-4.31, the Board of Education shall provide a daily recess period of at least twenty minutes for students in grades Kindergarten through five. A recess period is not required on a school day in which the day is substantially shortened due to a delayed opening or early dismissal. The recess period shall be outdoors, if feasible. A student shall not be denied recess for any reason, except as a consequence of a violation of the school district's Code of Student Conduct, including a harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB) investigation pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-13 et seq. Students may not be denied recess more than twice per week for a violation of the Code of Student Conduct or HIB investigation and these students shall be provided restorative justice activities during the recess period. Restorative justice activities mean activities designed to improve the socioemotional and behavioral responses of students through the use of more appropriate and less punitive interventions thereby establishing a more supportive and inclusive school culture. The student's recess period should be scheduled manner that does not interfere with the implementation a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP). School staff may deny recess for a student on the advice of a medical professional, school nurse, or the provisions of a student's IEP and/or 504 Plan.

A copy of the NJSLS for Comprehensive Health and Physical Education and all related curriculum/course guides and instructional material shall be available for public inspection in each school.

2431 ATHLETIC COMPETITION

The Board of Education recognizes the value of athletic competition as an integral part of the total school experience. Game activities and practice sessions provide opportunities to learn the values of competition and good sportsmanship.

For the purpose of this Policy programs of athletic competition include all activities relating to competitive sports contests, games, events, or sports exhibitions involving individual students or teams of students when such events occur within or between schools within this district or with any schools outside this district. The programs of athletic competition shall include, but are not limited to, high school interscholastic athletic programs, middle school interscholastic athletic programs where school teams or squads play teams or squads from other school districts, intramural athletic programs within a school or among schools in the district and any cheerleading program or activity in the school district.

Eligibility Standards

A student in any grade must maintain a satisfactory record of attendance to be eligible for participation in athletic competition. No student who has an unexcused absence for a school day may participate in an athletic competition, practice or activity scheduled for the afternoon or evening of that school day.

A student who wishes to participate in a program of athletic competition must submit, on a form provided by the district, the signed consent of his/her parent. The consent of the parent of a student who wishes to participate in a program of athletic competition will include an acknowledgment of the physical hazards that may be encountered in the activity.

Student participation in athletic competition shall be governed by the following eligibility standards.

High School

Fall and Winter Season Academic Eligibility

Grade nine (9) students that have not competed prior will have automatic eligibility in the Fall and Winter Seasons. A student in grade ten (10), eleven (11) and twelve (12) shall be eligible for athletic competition in the first semester (September 1 to January 31), if they have earned twenty-five percent (25%) of the one-hundred forty (140) credits required by the Randolph Board of Education in the previous school year. If the student has not earned at least thirty-five (35) credits in the previous school year, the student will be placed on probation and eligibility will be at the discretion of the Principal. If the student does not

earn at least thirty (30) credits (the NJSIAA minimum requirement), the student will be ineligible for participation.

Spring Season Academic Eligibility

A student in grade nine (9), ten (10), eleven (11) and twelve (12) shall be eligible for athletic competition in the second semester (February 1 to June 30), if they have earned twelve-point-five percent (12.5%) of the one-hundred forty (140) credits required by the Randolph Board of Education in the previous school year. If the student has not earned at least seventeen-point-five (17.5) credits in the previous semester, the student will be placed on probation and eligibility will be at the discretion of the Principal. If the student does not earn at least fifteen (15) credits (of the NJSIAA minimum requirement), the student will be ineligible for participation.

Student participation in a program of athletic competition shall be governed by the following eligibility standards:

- 1. To be eligible for participation in the interscholastic athletic program of a New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA) member school, all high school students must meet, at a minimum, all the eligibility requirements of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules and Regulations of the NJSIAA. Home schooled children are eligible to participate in the high school interscholastic athletic program of this district only if the school district, the parent, and the home schooled child comply with the Guidelines, Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of NJSIAA, and the policies and regulations of the Board of Education.
- 2. A student in any grade must maintain a satisfactory record of attendance to be eligible for participation in school district sponsored programs of athletic competition and must meet the criteria as outlined in district Attendance Policy and Regulation 5200. A student who is serving a suspension may not participate in school district sponsored programs of athletic competition, practice or activity while serving the suspension.
- 3. A student who is absent with an unexcused absence for a school day may not participate in school district sponsored programs of athletic competition the afternoon or evening of that school day.

4. A student in any grade who fails to adhere to student code of conduct may forfeit his/her eligibility for participation in school district sponsored programs of athletic competition.

Notice of the school district's eligibility requirements shall be available to students.

Required Examination – Interscholastic or Intramural Team or Squad

Students enrolled in grades six to twelve must receive a medical examination, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.7, prior to participation on a school-sponsored interscholastic or intramural team or squad and any cheerleading program or activity.

The examination shall be conducted within three hundred sixty five (365) days prior to the first day of official practice in an athletic season with examinations being conducted at the medical home or school physician of the student. The "medical home" is defined as a health care provider and that provider's practice site chosen by the student's parent for the provision of health care pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3. If a student does not have a medical home, the school district shall provide the examination at the school physician's office or other comparably equipped facility. The parent may choose either the school physician or their own private physician to provide this medical examination. The medical examination required prior to participation shall be in accordance with the requirements as outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-2.2(h)1 and Regulation 2431.2 and shall be documented using the Pre-participation Physical Evaluation form required by the Department of Education.

The school district shall distribute the Commissioner of Education developed sudden cardiac arrest pamphlet to a student participating in or desiring to participate in an athletic activity, as defined in N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.e., and the student's parent(s) shall each year and prior to participation by the student in an athletic activity comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.d.

The school district shall annually distribute the Commissioner of Education developed educational fact sheet relative to use and misuse of opioid drugs for sports related injuries to parents of students who participate in athletic activities and comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.10.

Information concerning a student's HIV/AIDS status shall not be required as part of the medical examination or health history pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:5C-1 et seq. The health findings of this medical examination shall be maintained as part of the student's health record.



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Emergency Procedures

Athletic coaches shall be trained and certified in CPR and in first aid to include sports-related concussion and head injuries, the use of a defibrillator, the identification of student athletes who are injured or disabled in the course of any athletic program or activity, and any other first aid procedures or other health related trainings required by law or the Superintendent.

The Superintendent shall prepare and present to the Board for its approval procedures for the emergency treatment of injuries and disabilities that occur in the course of any athletic program or activity. Emergency procedures shall be reviewed not less than once in each school year and shall be disseminated to appropriate staff members.

Interscholastic Standards

The Board shall approve annually a program of interscholastic athletics and shall require that all facilities utilized in that program, whether or not the property of this Board, properly safeguard both players and spectators and are kept free from hazardous conditions.

The Board adopts the Constitution, Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association as Board policy and shall review such rules on a regular basis to ascertain that they continue to be in conformity with the objectives of this Board.

The Athletic Director shall annually prepare schedule of athletic events. All interscholastic athletic competitions shall be posted on the district website www.rtnj.org.

The Athletic Director shall prepare rules for the conduct of students participating in interscholastic athletics that will conform to rules of the State Board of Education, the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association, and North West New Jersey Athletic Conference.

The administration may assess a reasonable fee for athletic participation.

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R 2431.2 MEDICAL EXAMINATION PRIOR TO PARTICIPATION ON A SCHOOL-SPONSORED INTERSCHOLASTIC OR INTRAMURAL TEAM OR SQUAD

Students are required to receive medical examinations in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.7 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-2.2(f) and (h). Each student medical examination shall be conducted at the medical home of the student. If a student does not have a medical home, the school district shall provide the examination at the school physician's office or other comparably equipped facility.

The school district shall ensure students receive medical examinations in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-2.2(h) and prior to participation on a school-sponsored interscholastic or intramural team or squad for students in grades six through twelve.

A. Required Medical Examination

- 1. The examination shall be conducted within 365 days prior to the first day of official practice in an athletic season and shall be conducted by a licensed physician, advanced practice nurse (APN), or physician assistant (PA).
- 2. The physical examination shall be documented using the Preparticipation Physical Evaluation (PPE) form developed jointly by the American Academy of Family Physicians, American Academy of Pediatrics, American College of Sports Medicine, American Medical Society for Sports Medicine, American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine, and American Osteopathic Academy of Sports Medicine and is available online at, http://www.state.nj.us/education/students/safety/health/records/athleticphysicalsform.pdf, in accordance with N.J.S.A.18A:40-41.7.
 - a. Prior to performing a pre-participation physical examination, the licensed physician, APN, or PA who performs the student-athlete's physical examination shall complete the Student-Athlete Cardiac Screening professional development module and shall sign the certification statement on the PPE form attesting to the completion, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.d.
 - (1) If the PPE form is submitted without the signed certification statement and the school district has confirmed that the licensed physician, APN, or PA from the medical home did



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not complete the module, the student-athlete's parent may obtain a physical examination from a physician who can certify completion of the module or request that the school physician provides the examination.

- b. The medical report shall indicate if a student is allowed or not allowed to participate in the required sports categories and shall be completed and signed by the original examining physician, APN, or PA.
- c. An incomplete form shall be returned to the student's medical home for completion unless the school nurse can provide documentation to the school physician that the missing information is available from screenings completed by the school nurse or physician within the prior 365 days.
- 3. Each student whose medical examination was completed more than ninety days prior to the first day of official practice in an athletic season shall provide a health history update questionnaire completed and signed by the student's parent. The completed health history update questionnaire shall include information listed below as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.7.b. The completed health history update questionnaire shall be reviewed by the school nurse and, if applicable, the school athletic trainer and shall include information as to whether, in the time period since the date of the student's last pre-participation physical examination, the student has:
 - a. Been advised by a licensed physician, APN, or PA not to participate in a sport;
 - b. Sustained a concussion, been unconscious, or lost memory from a blow to the head;
 - c. Broken a bone or sprained, strained, or dislocated any muscles or joints;
 - d. Fainted or blacked out;
 - e. Experienced chest pains, shortness of breath, or heart racing;
 - f. Had a recent history of fatigue and unusual tiredness;



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- g. Been hospitalized, visited an emergency room, or had a significant medical illness:
- h. Started or stopped taking any over the counter or prescribed medications; or
- i. Had a sudden death in the family, or whether any member of the student's family under the age of fifty has had a heart attack or heart trouble.
- 4. The school district shall provide to the parent written notification signed by the school physician stating approval of the student's participation in athletics based upon the medical report or the reasons for the school physician's disapproval of the student's participation.
- 5. The Board of Education will not permit a student enrolled in grades six to twelve to participate on a school-sponsored interscholastic or intramural team or squad unless the student submits a PPE form signed by the licensed physician, APN, or PA who performed the physical examination and, if applicable, a completed health history update questionnaire, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.7.c.

B. Sudden Cardiac Arrest Pamphlet

The school district shall distribute to a student participating in or desiring to participate in an athletic activity and the student's parent, each year and prior to participation by the student in an athletic activity, the sudden cardiac arrest pamphlet developed by the Commissioner of Education in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.

- 1. A student and his or her parent shall, each year and prior to the participation of the student in an athletic activity, sign and return to the student's school the form developed by the Commissioner acknowledging the receipt and review of the information pamphlet, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.d.
- 2. The Commissioner shall distribute the pamphlet, at no charge, to all school districts and nonpublic schools, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.b.
- 3. "Athletic activity" for the purposes of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41 means: interscholastic athletics; an athletic contest or competition, other than interscholastic athletics, that is sponsored by or associated with a school



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district or nonpublic school, including cheerleading and club-sponsored sports activities; and any practice or interschool practice or scrimmage for those activities.

C. Use and Misuse of Opioid Fact Sheet

The school district shall annually distribute to the parents of student-athletes participating in an interscholastic sports program or cheerleading program the educational fact sheet developed by the Commissioner of Education concerning the use and misuse of opioid drugs in the event that a student-athlete or cheerleader is prescribed an opioid for a sports-related injury in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.10.

- 1. The district shall distribute the educational fact sheet annually to the parents of student-athletes and cheerleaders and shall obtain a signed acknowledgment of the receipt of the fact sheet by the student-athlete or cheerleader and his or her parent pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:40-41.10(b).
- 2. The fact sheet and sign-off sheet shall be distributed and the sign-off sheet shall be completed and returned to the school annually prior to the student-athlete's or cheerleader's first official practice of the school year.

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Practice and Pre-Season Heat-Acclimation for School-Sponsored Athletics and Extra-Curricular Activities

2431.3 PRACTICE AND PRE-SEASON HEAT-ACCLIMATION FOR SCHOOL-SPONSORED ATHLETICS AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The Board of Education adopts this Policy as a measure to protect the safety, health and welfare of students participating in school-sponsored interscholastic athletic programs-and extra-curricular activities. The Board believes practice and pre-season heat-acclimation guidelines for students will minimize injury and enhance the a student's health, performance, and well-being.

Therefore, the Board of Education requires the implementation of the practice and preseason heat-acclimation procedures as recommended by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA) for students participating in all school-sponsored athletic programs and extra-curricular activities during warm weather months. The Superintendent of Schools or designee shall ensure the implementation of the Practice and Pre-Season Heat-Acclimation Procedures.

The Superintendent of Schools or designee may reduce the practice times or adjust other provisions that would reduce a student's exertion if weather and/or temperature warrants such action.

This Policy and the school district's practice and pre-season heat-acclimation procedure shall be approved by the school district's physician prior to Board of Education approval.

2431.8 <u>VARSITY LETTERS FOR INTERSCHOLASTIC</u> EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:42-7, a school district that includes any of the grades nine through twelve shall adopt a policy to provide a student enrolled in those grades who participates in any school-sponsored, interscholastic extracurricular activity that includes competitions in which the student competes against students enrolled in schools outside of the school district may be eligible to earn a varsity letter awarded by the school district.

The Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, shall approve the school-sponsored, interscholastic extracurricular activities that include competitions in which students compete against other students enrolled in schools outside of the school district. The criteria for a student to earn a varsity letter in the school-sponsored, interscholastic extracurricular activity shall be approved by the Superintendent or designee.

Nothing in N.J.S.A. 18A:42-7 or this Policy shall be construed to require the school district to award varsity letters or to establish any school-sponsored, interscholastic extracurricular activity.

2610 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM EVALUATION

The Board of Education directs the Superintendent to develop and implement a systematic plan for the continuous evaluation of the educational program against the educational goals established by this Board. The Superintendent shall employ such tests and methods that will ensure decision making is data driven and a variety of sources of data are used to analyze and monitor student achievement and progress, as well as evaluate school programs. Wherever possible, the assessment program shall follow evaluation procedures set forth in the course guides.

The Superintendent shall maintain a calendar of assessment activities and shall make periodic evaluation reports to the Board that evaluate the progress of students and the effectiveness of staff members. The Superintendent shall use multiple (more than two) sources of data to monitor student achievement and the progress of students. The Superintendent shall also use multiple (more than two) sources of data to evaluate the effectiveness of programs, initiatives, and strategies.

The Board will annually make available to the public the collective progress of students toward the goals of the district. The Board will annually, prior to the end of the school year and in conjunction with appropriate members of the administrative staff, conduct a review of the educational progress of the district, assess district and student needs, and establish long range and short range objectives for the educational program. The Board's annual report will be submitted to the Commissioner of Education as required.

The Superintendent shall annually recommend improvements in the educational program based on the Board's evaluation of the district's program. The Board reserves the right to employ experts from outside the school district to serve in the evaluation process.

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R 5200 ATTENDANCE

A. Definitions

- 1. For the purposes of school attendance, a "day in session" shall be a day on which the school is open and students are under the guidance and direction of a teacher or teachers engaged in the teaching process. Days on which school is closed for such reasons as holidays, teachers' institutes, and inclement weather shall not be considered as days in session.
- 2. A "school day" shall consist of not less than four hours, except that one continuous session of two and one-half hours may be considered a full day of Kindergarten.
- 3. "A day of attendance" shall be one in which the student is present for a full day under the guidance and direction of a teacher while school is in session.
 - a. Whenever over-crowded conditions make it necessary to hold two separate sessions with a different group of students in each session, a student attending for all of either session shall be regarded as having attended for the full day. An excused absence for any reason shall not be counted as a day of attendance in the school register.
- 4. A "half-day class" shall be considered the equivalent of a full day's attendance only if in session for four hours or more, exclusive of recess periods or lunch periods.
- 5. An "excused absence" is a student's absence from school for the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14 through 18A:36-16 or any absences considered excused by the New Jersey Department of Education.
- 6. Absences include full day absences and absences from individual class(es) that result in ten (10) minutes or more of the period being missed.

B. Attendance Recording

1. A record of the attendance of all students on roll in a school register shall be kept each day that school is in session by a teacher or other authorized person. It shall be the duty of this person to keep the attendance records



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according to these rules and the specific instructions issued by the Commissioner of Education.

- 2. No student shall be recorded as present unless the school is in session and the student so recorded is under the guidance and direction of a teacher in the teaching process.
- 3. A student shall be recorded as absent in the school register when not in attendance at a session of the school while a member of the school, except students excused due to absences recognized by the New Jersey Department of Education who shall be recorded as excused.
- 4. A student shall be recorded as either present, absent, or excused for absences recognized by the New Jersey Department of Education, every day the school is in session after the student enters until the date the student is transferred to another school, transferred to an individual home instruction record, or officially leaves the school system.
- 5. The Commissioner shall annually prescribe a list of religious holidays on which it shall be mandatory to excuse students for religious observance upon the written request signed by the parent or person standing in loco parentis.
- 6. The mere presence of a student at roll call shall not be regarded as sufficient attendance for compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3. In a school which is in session during both the forenoon and the afternoon, a student shall be present at least one hour during both the forenoon and the afternoon in order to be recorded as present for the full day. In a school which is in session during either the forenoon or the afternoon, a student shall be present at least two hours in the session in order to be recorded as present for the full day.
- 7. A student not present in school because of his/her participation in an approved school activity, such as a field trip, meeting, cooperative education assignment, athletic competition or any activity connected to school programs will be considered to be in attendance.
- C. Unexcused Absences That Count Toward Truancy/Excused Absences



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- 1. "An unexcused absence that counts toward truancy" is a student's absence from school for a full or a portion of a day for any reason that is not an "excused absence" as defined below.
- 2. Family vacations, trips and travel days will be recorded as unexcused absences.
- 3. Performance of household, or babysitting duties will be recorded as unexcused absences.
- 4. "Cut Days" and/or days prior to or following a prom weekend will be recorded as unexcused absences.
- 5. "An excused absence" is a student's absence from school for a full day or a portion of a day for the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14 through 16, or any absence for the reasons listed below:
 - a. Where appropriate, when consistent with Individualized Education Programs, the Individuals with Disabilities Act, accommodation plans under 29 U.S.C. §§ 794 and 705(20), and individualized health care plans;
 - b. Take Our Children to Work Day;
 - c. An absence considered excused by a New Jersey Department of Education rule; (College visits; maximum of three (3) per year grades 11 and 12).
- 6. The following absences are not excused per New Jersey Department of Education and may count towards loss of credit. If appropriate documentation is not provided with specific dates when the student returns to school, (not to exceed five school days beyond the students return to school) the absence may or may not count toward loss of credit.
 - a. Student illness only if supported by a doctor/physician's note.
 - i. It is recognized that not all illnesses require a visit to a doctor/physician. If this is the case, the absence will count toward loss of credit and is the reason why students are allowed a reasonable number of unexcused absences before losing credit.



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- ii. Necessary and unavoidable medical and dental appointments that cannot be schedule at a time other than the school day.
- b. Family illness or death;
- c. The student's suspension from school;
- d. The student's required attendance in court;
- e. Interviews with a prospective employer or with an admissions officer of an institution of higher education;
- f. Examination(s) for a driver's license;

In order for an absence to be considered excused as it relates to loss of credit, appropriate documentation with specific dates for any of the reasons listed above must be provided (not to exceed five school days beyond the students return to school).

- 7. Absences accrued due to participation in school sponsored activities that take place during the day are exempt from the attendance policy.
- 8. "Truancy" means ten or more cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy of a student between the ages of six and sixteen as determined by the Board's Attendance Policy and Regulation pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4.iii. and the definition of school day pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3. Any absence not listed in C.4 and 5 above shall be an unexcused absence counted toward truancy.
- D. Notice to School of a Student's Absence
 - 1. The parent or adult student is requested to call the school office before the start of the student's school day.
 - 2. The parent of the student or an adult student who will attend the morning session, but will not attend the afternoon session should call or provide notice to the school office before the start of the afternoon session.
 - 3. The parent or adult student who anticipates a future absence or anticipates that an absence will be prolonged should notify the school office to arrange make-up work and no work may be provided ahead of time for vacations.



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- 4. If a parent does not contact the attendance office, the office will make every effort to contact the parent.
- E. Notification to parents of student absences will be as follows:
 - 1. Digital copies of the letters will be posted in the online parent portal as follows:
 - a. After the 4th, 9th, 13th, 17th and 18th absences for full year courses;
 - b. After the 4^{th} , 7^{th} , 9^{th} and 10^{th} absence for semester courses;
 - c. After the 2^{nd} , 4^{th} and 5^{th} absences in quarter courses.
 - 2. Hard copy letters will be mailed home as follows:
 - a. After the 17th and 18th absences in a full year course;
 - b. After the 7th and 9th absences in a semester course;
 - c. After the 4th and 5th absences in a quarter course.
- F. Readmission to School after an Absence
 - 1. A student returning from an absence of any length of time must provide a written statement that is dated and signed by the parent or adult student listing the reason for the absence.
 - 2. A note explaining a student's absence for a non-communicable illness for a period of more than two (2) school days must be accompanied by a physician's statement of the student's illness with medical clearance to return to school.
 - 3. A student who has been absent by reason of having or being suspected of having a communicable disease must present to the school nurse written evidence of being free of communicable disease, in accordance with Policy 8451.
- G. Instruction



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- 1. Teachers shall cooperate in the preparation of home assignments for students who anticipate an excused absence of ten (10) school days' duration. The parent or student must request such home assignments.
- 2. A student who anticipates an absence due to a temporary or chronic health condition may be eligible for home instruction in accordance with Policy 2412. The parent must request home instruction.
- 3. Students absent for any reason are expected to make up the work missed. The parent or student is responsible for requesting missed assignments and any assistance required. Teachers will provide make-up assignments as necessary.
- 4. In general, students will be allowed one make up day for each day of school missed.
- 5. A student who missed a test or an exam shall be offered an opportunity to take the test, exam, or an appropriate alternate test.

H. Denial of Course Credit

- 1. The teacher will determine the credit to be awarded a student for make-up work. Where class participation is a factor in the learning process, the teacher may consider a student's absence in determining a final grade, except absences which are excused absences as described in Section C. will not adversely affect the student's grade. The teacher may record an incomplete grade for a student who has not had a full opportunity to make up missed work.
- 2. To receive credit for a course, a student must attend class on a regular basis and complete all requirements of the scheduled course. A student may not be granted credit toward graduation in a scheduled course after the absences exceed eighteen (18) per year in a full year course, nine (9) per semester in a semester course and four (4) per quarter in a quarter course.
 - a. A secondary student who has been dropped from a course of study will be assigned to an alternate program such as restricted study.
 - b. A secondary student denied course credit may attend a credit completion session to regain denied credit. Such a program may include "summer



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- school" or the online credit recovery program through Educere at the student's expense.
- c. A student may elect to participate in Physical Education (P/E) make up sessions; two make up sessions are equivalent to one unexcused absence.
- I. School District Response to Unexcused Absences during the School Year that Count Toward Truancy
 - 1. For up to four cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy, the Principal or designee shall:
 - a. Make a reasonable attempt to notify the student's parent of each unexcused absence prior to the start of the following school day;
 - b. Make a reasonable attempt to determine the cause of the unexcused absence, including through contact with the student's parent;
 - c. Identify, in consultation with the student's parents, needed action designed to address patterns of unexcused absences, if any, and to have the child return to school and maintain regular attendance;
 - d. Proceed in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 9:6-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-10, if a potentially missing or abused child situation is detected; and
 - e. Cooperate with law enforcement and other authorities and agencies, as appropriate.
 - 2. For between five and nine cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy, the Principal or designee shall:
 - a. Make a reasonable attempt to notify the student's parent of each unexcused absence prior to the start of the following school day;
 - b. Make a reasonable attempt to determine the cause of the unexcused absence, including through contact with the student's parent;
 - c. Evaluate the appropriateness of action taken pursuant to N.J.A.C.



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6A:16-7.6(a)4.i.(3) and I.1.c. above;

- d. Develop an action plan to establish outcomes based upon the student's patterns of unexcused absences and to specify the interventions for supporting the student's return to school and regular attendance, which may include any or all of the following:
 - (1) Refer or consult with the building's Intervention and Referral Services Team, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-8;
 - (2) Conduct testing, assessments, or evaluations of the student's academic, behavioral, and health needs;
 - (3) Consider an alternate educational placement;
 - (4) Make a referral to or coordinate with a community-based social and health provider agency or other community resource;
 - (5) Refer to a court or court program pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4.iv. and I.4. below;
 - (6) Proceed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 9:6-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-10, if a potential missing or abused child situation is detected; and
 - (7) Engage the student's family.
- e. Cooperate with law enforcement and other authorities and agencies, as appropriate.
- 3. For ten or more cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy, a student between the ages of six and sixteen is truant, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25, and the Principal or designee shall:
 - a. Make a determination regarding the need for a court referral for the truancy, per N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4.iv. and I.4. below;
 - b. Continue to consult with the parent and the involved agencies to support the student's return to school and regular attendance;



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- c. Cooperate with law enforcement and other authorities and agencies, as appropriate; and
- d. Proceed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:38-28 through 31, Article 3B, Compelling Attendance at School, and other applicable State and Federal statutes, as required.
- 4. A court referral may be made as follows:
 - a. When unexcused absences that count toward truancy are determined by school officials to be violations of the compulsory education law, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25, and the Board of Education's policies, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a), the parent may be referred to Municipal Court.
 - (1) A written report of the actions the school has taken regarding the student's attendance shall be forwarded to the Municipal Court; or
 - b. When there is evidence of a juvenile-family crisis, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-22.g, the student may be referred to Superior Court, Chancery Division, Family Part.
 - (1) A written report of the actions the school has taken regarding the student's attendance shall be forwarded to the Juvenile-Family Crisis Intervention Unit.
- 5. For a student with a disability, the attendance plan and its punitive and remedial procedures shall be applied, where applicable, in accordance with the student's IEP, pursuant to 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et seq., the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; the procedural protections set forth in N.J.A.C. 6A:14; accommodation plan under 29 U.S.C. §§794 and 705(20); and individualized health care plan and individualized emergency healthcare plan pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-2.3(b)5.xii.
- 6. All receiving schools pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14-7.1(a), shall act in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4.i. and I.1. above for each student with up to four cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy.



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- a. For each student attending a receiving school with five or more cumulative unexcused absences that count toward truancy, the absences shall be reported to the sending school district.
 - (1) The sending school district shall proceed in accordance with the Board of Education's policies and procedures pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a) and I.5. above and the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6(a)4.ii. through iv. and I.2. through I.5. above, as appropriate.

J. Discipline

- 1. Students may be denied participation in co-curricular activities per Policy 2430. A student in any grade must maintain a satisfactory record of attendance to be eligible for participation in co-curricular activities. A student who has an unexcused absence for a school day may not participate in a co-curricular activity scheduled for the afternoon or evening of that school day.
- 2. Students may be denied participation in athletic competition per Policy 2431. A student in any grade must maintain a satisfactory record of attendance to be eligible for participation in athletics. Students who are on track to be chronically absent (ten percent of the school year) may lose the privilege to participate in athletic programs. A student who has an unexcused absence for a school day may not participate in an athletic competition or practice scheduled for the afternoon or evening of that school day.
- 3. No student who is absent from school for New Jersey Department of Education recognized absence may be deprived of any award or of eligibility for or opportunity to compete for any award because of the absence.

K. Recording Attendance

1. Teachers must accurately record the students present, tardy, or absent each day in each session or each class. Attendance records must also record students' attendance at out-of-school curricular events such as field trips.



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- 2. A record shall be maintained of each excused absence and each unexcused absence that counts toward truancy as defined in Policy and Regulation 5200.
- 3. A report card will record the number of times the student was absent and tardy in each marking period.
- 4. A student's absence for observance of a religious holiday will not be recorded as such on any transcript or application or employment form.

L. Appeal

- 1. Students may be subject to appropriate discipline for their school attendance record.
- 2. A student who has been retained at grade level for excessive absences may appeal that action in accordance with Policy 5410.
- 3. A student who has been dropped from a course and/or denied course credit for excessive absences may appeal that action in accordance with the following procedures:
 - a. The student shall file a written appeal to the Principal or designee within five school days of receiving notice of the action. The appeal should state the reasons for each absence, any documentation that may support reducing the number of unexcused absences for the purposes of course credit, and reasons why the student should either continue to be enrolled in the course or receive course credit for a class the student completed.
 - b. The Principal or designee will respond in writing no later than seven school days after receiving the student's appeal.
 - c. If the student is not satisfied, he/she may submit a written request to the Principal for consideration by an Attendance Review Committee.
 - d. On a student's request for consideration by an Attendance Review Committee, the Principal shall convene an Attendance Review Committee. The Attendance Review Committee shall meet informally to hear the student's appeal. The student's parent(s) and teacher(s) may attend the meeting.



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- e. Careful evaluation of extenuating or mitigating circumstances shall be made by the Attendance Review Committee, adhering to the following criteria which shall include but not be limited to:
 - (1) The student's record of attendance to date;
 - (2) The academic performance demonstrated to date;
 - (3) The student's disciplinary record.
- f. The Attendance Review Committee shall decide the appeal and inform the student in writing within seven school days of the meeting.
- g. The student may appeal an adverse decision of the Attendance Review Committee to the Superintendent, the Board of Education, and the Commissioner of Education in accordance with Policy 5710, Student Grievance and N.J.S.A. 18A. An appeal to the Attendance Review Committee shall be considered to have exhausted the first two steps of the grievance procedure outlined in Policy 5710.

M. Class Cuts

Students who are absent from class for more than ten (10) minutes without authorization while in attendance that day will be considered cutting their class(es) and will be dealt with in the following manner.

- 1. First Class Cut: parents will be contacted by the classroom teacher, the student's counselor will be notified and the Vice Principal will discuss the cut with the student. Consequences will be per the Code-of-Conduct.
- 2. Second Class Cut: parents will be contacted by the Vice Principal. The Vice Principal will inform both the student and the parents that one more cut will result in loss of credit. The student will be assigned consequences per the Code-of-Conduct. Parents will be notified that the student is one cut away from revocation of course credit.
- 3. Third Class Cut: the Vice Principal will notify the student's parents. The student may lose course credit required for graduation and be subject to consequences as per the Code-of-Conduct.



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4. Additional class cuts will result in an administrative review and disciplinary consequences.

N. Quarter Courses

- 1. First Class Cut: parents will be notified / contacted by the teacher. The student's counselor will be notified and the Vice Principal will discuss the cut with the student. Consequences as per the Code-of-Conduct.
- 2. Second Class Cut: the Vice Principal will notify the student's parents. The student may lose course credit required for graduation. The student may be assigned to a restricted study for the remainder of the semester.

O. Tardiness to School and Class

- 1. Students who are tardy to school must report to the attendance office to sign in and obtain a tardy pass to class. Students who are excessively tardy will be subject to disciplinary action by the administration as follows:
 - a. Every three (3) tardies to class is counted as equivalent to a cut of that course. Consequences will be imposed as per the Code-of-Conduct. In the event that a student is tardy to homeroom, every three (3) tardies will be assigned consequences at the discretion of the administration.

P. Attendance Records

1. Attendance records for the school district and each school will be maintained and attendance rates will be calculated as required by the New Jersey Department of Education. The school district will comply with all attendance requirements and any improvement plans as required by the Department of Education.

5351 STUDENT VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

The Randolph Township Board of Education recognizes that school district personnel must take seriously all suggestions, demonstrations, or communications of life-threatening violence. When confronted with an actual situation in which violent and life-threatening behavior or ideation is present, commitment to student confidentiality is superseded by the imperative for initiating effective intervention.

It shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent to insure implementation of an awareness and prevention program and a violence response plan. District programs on the recognition, prevention and management of life-threatening violent behavior and ideation will be conducted as appropriate for staff, students and parent(s) or legal guardian(s).

In order to prevent violence, the district has developed a Violence Response Plan to manage the referral process, evaluation of the student(s) involved and crisis follow-up. The Violence Response Plan involves support for students, parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and staff provided by district and community resources. Failure of a parent(s) or legal guardian(s) or adult student to cooperate fully with the guidelines set forth in this policy and the Violence Response Plan may result in a hearing before the Board of Education and the student's expulsion from school.

All suggestions, demonstrations, or communications of life-threatening violence are subject to the following response:

- 1. Life-threatening violent behavior or ideation must be reported to the Building Principal immediately.
- 2. The Building Principal shall determine if it is necessary to implement the referral process and evaluation/action procedures within the established Violence Response Plan.
- 3. The Building Principal shall notify the Superintendent of the situation and the level of evaluation/action deemed necessary as soon as possible. Under no circumstances is the notification to exceed twenty four hours.

In no case should any staff member take it upon him/herself to counsel a student outside of this policy and the established Violence Response Plan.

Within twenty school days of the adoption of this policy, and annually at the beginning of the school year, the Building Principal shall hold an in-service meeting with all staff to review this Violence Prevention Policy and Response Plan.



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Situations in which violent and life-threatening behavior or ideation is present require the immediate implementation of established procedures for referral, evaluation and follow-up as outlined below. Procedures within this Plan are subject to appropriate State and federal laws including the Individuals with Disabilities in Educations Act.

A. Referral Process

- 1. Any staff member, student or parent(s) or legal guardian(s) who has reason to believe that a student has violent or life-threatening intentions shall notify the Principal immediately.
- 2. The Principal or designee with the school psychologist or school social worker in attendance shall conduct an interview of the student to determine if further evaluation/action is needed.

B. Evaluation/Action

- 1. If, following the interview of the student and consultation with the school psychologist or social worker, the Principal determines that further evaluation is not warranted, the Principal shall:
 - a. Reserve the right to discipline the student as appropriate.
 - b. Take any other reasonable actions warranted under the circumstances.
- 2. If, following the interview of the student and consultation with the school psychologist or social worker, the Principal determines that further evaluation and intervention is warranted, the Principal shall:
 - a. Notify student's school counselor or Vice Principal.
 - b. Notify the local police immediately of the incident and cooperate with their investigation.
 - c. The student shall be excluded from school and school sponsored events pending the outcome of an assessment / evaluation.

- d. Contact the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to pick up the student immediately and seek an assessment for level of risk prior to returning to school.
- e. Notify the potential victim and his/her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) if the potential victim is a minor.
- f. Notify the Director of Special Services, Superintendent or his/her designee and the school level Crisis Response Team.
- g. Have the parent(s) or legal guardian(s), or in the case of an adult student, have the adult student sign a two way release of information to allow district staff to speak to the student's treating mental health care provider.
- h. Have the student seen by a Board approved psychiatrist at Board expense within ten school days.
- i. Take any other reasonable actions warranted under the circumstances.
- j. Provide an option for home instruction if appropriate.

C. Follow-up

- 1. At the conclusion of the evaluation process, the appropriate school personnel and the district's designated mental health professional will hold a reentry meeting concerning the appropriateness of the student's return to school. They shall make a recommendation in that regard to the Principal. The Principal shall then determine whether the student may return to school. If the Principal determines not to allow the student to return to school, the student or the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) may appeal that decision to the Superintendent. In the event of an appeal, the Superintendent will make the final determination regarding the student's return to school.
- 2. When the student returns to school, the student's school counselor shall monitor the student's adjustment to school through meetings with the student and consultations with the classroom teachers. The school counselor shall report as needed to the Principal.

3. District and State documentation shall be done by appropriate administration. Copies of district reports shall be kept in the school nurse's secured medical file, as well as in the student's file. When a student moves from elementary to middle school and from middle school to high school, his/her report(s) shall be hand delivered to the nurse of the receiving school.

D. Post – Incident

In actual situations of violence or life-threatening behavior, the district's School Crisis Team will be notified by the Director of Special Services and Superintendent will determine appropriate venues for communication.

5511 DRESS AND GROOMING

The Board seeks parental cooperation in helping the school attain its objective of fostering pride and good taste in clothes and grooming by exercising such positive parental guidance and authority as may be deemed appropriate to you. The Board will, at all times, continue to exercise its prerogative to inform parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) of individual children of our concern or question as regards either the suitability or permissibility of certain attire. The Board feels confident that, together, we can engender a positive attitude toward dress and grooming in the youth of our community. For the specific guidance of parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) and staff, the Board provided the following guidelines based on past decisions.

- 1. In the matter of hair style, the Board recognizes that students have the right to exercise judgment so long as they do not:
 - a. Present a danger to their health and safety, or the health and safety of the staff and student body; and
 - b. Cause an interference with school work and create a classroom disorder.
- 2. With regard to student dress, the Board specifies the following policy:
 - a. Students may not wear clothing deemed to be a safety hazard while participating in activities so regulated;
 - b. Dress which restricts the student from doing his/her best work is discouraged;
 - c. Styles that create or may create a classroom disturbance are not permitted;
 - d. Articles of clothing which cause excessive wear or damage to school property are not permitted; and
 - e. Wearing apparel which may be a health hazard to the student is not permitted while in school, without doctor's permission.

Nothing in this policy shall be interpreted to limit the responsibility of teachers to enforce regulations concerning control of hair or clothing in the interest of safety or full participation in any specific teaching situation.

A. Elementary School

We all agree that an academic environment is best supported by apparel that is not distracting, and not inappropriate. High expectations of achievement and behavior are an integral part of the elementary culture. An extension of these high expectations to good grooming and appropriate dress enhances and improves student responsibility and self-esteem.

The Randolph Township Dress Code Policy requires that clothes should not cause a disruption to the teaching/learning environment.

- 1. Specific items of apparel that are inappropriate include:
 - a. Halter-tops, belly shirts, thin (spaghetti straps), and bare midriffs;
 - b. Any clothing or personal items that depict violence, profanity or offensive illustrations;
 - c. Shorts, skirts and dresses that do not reach the individual's fingertips when his/her arm is at their side; and

Hooded sweatshirts; may be worn to school, but at no time during the school day may the hood be worn up. All headgear, including hats, will be stored in the classroom during the school day. Baseball caps cannot be worn in school.

A dress code is only as effective as the personnel enforcing it. The entire staff, not just teachers, needs to be responsible for reporting to the office infractions of our dress code. The key to effectiveness is intervention. The final decision rests with the building administration.

B. Middle School

The guidelines for the school dress code were developed after careful consideration. The philosophy behind them has always been that a strong relationship exists between the clothing a child wears and his/her general attitude and behavior in school. We feel strongly that the casual nature of certain attire could generate an



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indifferent attitude toward the student's real purpose of being in school. It will remain our policy to discourage and limit outlandish or questionable attire which negatively impacts the educational process. Examples of inappropriate dress include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Clothing items that display graphics or slogans that are deemed suggestive, offensive, or include drug-related or alcohol-related messages are not acceptable;
- 2. Halter tops and low-cut tops are not acceptable for school, nor are bare midriff tops or see-through mesh shirts;
- 3. Undergarments should not be visible when dressed appropriately;
- 4. Skirts and shorts should be of an appropriate length. Baseball hats, other types of headwear, and sunglasses are not permitted in the building; and
- 5. For safety reasons, appropriate footwear should be worn.

We, therefore, ask for your continued cooperation in helping the school to attain its objective of fostering pride and good taste in clothes and grooming. At all times, we will continue to exercise prerogative to inform parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) of individual students as regards either the suitability or permissibility of certain attire. Final decisions regarding dress and grooming rest with the building administration.

C. High School

The school's objective is to foster pride and good taste in cloths and grooming for all members of the school community. The school recognizes that students have a right to exercise judgment so long as choices do not cause an interference with schoolwork and/or create a classroom disorder, and/or present a danger to health and safety or the health and safety of the staff and student body. In keeping with this objective, any accessory that may cause injury is unacceptable, such as studded accessories and chains. Footwear must be worn at all times.

The school discourages outfits that are too revealing of the anatomy and those that do not cover undergarments when students are standing or sitting. Bare midriffs, tube tops; backless garments, one shoulder tops, tops with spaghetti straps, mesh and/or see through tops, and skirts and shorts that are exceedingly short are not acceptable.



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Garments meant to be worn as undergarments may not be worn as outerwear. Hooded garments may be worn as long as the hood remains down and does not cover the head. Clothing and accessories with slogans, symbols or displays about (or suggestive of) inappropriate language, sayings, weapons, logos, racial implications, sex, and which is disruptive to the educational environment is also unacceptable and prohibited. Any garment promoting alcohol, tobacco or drugs is strictly forbidden. Teachers have the prerogative to require students to remove coats, hats and other headdress during instructional time.

If students appear to be in violation of this policy in addition to parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) notification the following consequences will be applied:

- First Offense A school-approved tee shirt will be lent to the student to be worn for the remainder of the day.
- Second Offense An after school detention will be assigned.
- Third Offense A Saturday detention will be assigned.
- Fourth Offense Student will be suspended, a parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) conference will be necessary before reentry.

Final decisions regarding dress and grooming rest with the building administration.

5600 STUDENT DISCIPLINE/CODE OF CONDUCT

The Board of Education adopts this Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy to establish standards, policies, and procedures for positive student development and student behavioral expectations on school grounds and, as appropriate, for conduct away from school grounds. Every student enrolled in this district shall observe promulgated rules and regulations and the discipline imposed for infraction of those rules.

The Superintendent of Schools will establish a process for the annual review and update of the district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation that may involve a committee of parents, students, and community members that represent, where possible, the composition of the district's schools and community. The Superintendent will report to the Board the process used for the annual review of this Policy and Regulation and will recommend to the Board updates, if any, to the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.

The Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be disseminated annually to all school staff, students, and parents. The Board of Education shall provide to all employees annual training on the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation, which shall include training on the prevention, intervention, and remediation of student conduct that violates the district's Policy and Regulation. Information on the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be incorporated into the orientation for new employees.

The Board provides for the district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct's equitable application. Student discipline and the Code of Student Conduct will be applied without regard to race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin; nationality; sex; gender; sexual orientation; gender identity or expression; martial, domestic-partnership, or civil union; mental, physical or sensory disability; or by any other distinguishing characteristic, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5.-1 et seq.

For students with disabilities, subject to Individualized Education Programs in accordance with 20 U.S.C. §1400 et seq., the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act and accommodation plans under 29 U.S.C. §§ 794 and 705(20), the Code of Student Conduct shall be implemented in accordance with the components of the applicable plans.

The Student Discipline/Code of Conduct is established for the purposes outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(b).



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Policy and Regulation 5600 include a description of student responsibilities that include expectations for academic achievement, behavior, and attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8 and 12.1; a description of behaviors that will result in suspension or expulsion, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2; and a description of student rights pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)3.i through vii.

The Board of Education approves the use of comprehensive behavioral supports that promote positive student development and the students' abilities to fulfill the behavioral expectations established by the Board. These behavioral supports include, but are not limited to, positive reinforcement for good conduct and academic success including the programs that honor and reward student conduct and academic achievement; supportive intervention and referral services including those services outlined in Policy 2417; remediation of problem behaviors that take into account the behavior's nature, the students' developmental ages and the students' histories of problem behaviors and performance; and for students with disabilities, the behavior interventions and supports shall be determined and provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

Policy and Regulation 5600 include a description of school responses to violations of behavioral expectations established by the Board that, at a minimum, are graded according to the severity of the offenses, and consider the developmental ages of the student offenders and their histories of inappropriate behaviors pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)5.

Students are required to be in compliance with Policy and Regulation 5200 – Attendance pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6 and Policy 5512 – Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7.

The Building Principal shall maintain a current list of community-based health and social service provider agencies available to support a student and the student's family, as appropriate, and a list of legal resources available to serve the community.

The Building Principal or designee shall have the authority to assign discipline to students. School authorities also have the right to impose a consequence on a student for conduct away from school grounds that is consistent with the district's Code of Student Conduct pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5. This authority shall be exercised only when it is reasonably necessary for the student's physical or emotional safety, security, and well-being or for reasons relating to the safety, security, and well-being of other students, staff, or school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:25-2 and 18A:37-2. This authority shall be exercised only when the conduct that is the subject of the proposed consequence materially and substantially interferes with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school. Consequences pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5 shall be handled in



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accordance with Policy and Regulation 5600, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1, and as appropriate, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7-2, 6A:16-7.3, or 6A:16-7.4. School authorities shall respond to harassment, intimidation, or bullying that occurs off school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14 and 15.3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3, 7.1, and 7.7.

Consequences and appropriate remedial action for a student who commits one or more acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying may range from positive behavioral interventions up to and including suspension or expulsion. The factors for determining consequences and remedial measures and examples of consequences and remedial measures are listed in Policy 5512 – Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying. Consequences for a student who commits an act of harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall be varied and graded according to the nature of the behavior, the developmental age of the student and the student's history of problem behaviors and performance, and shall be consistent with this Policy and the school district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1. Remedial measures for one or more acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall be designed to correct the problem behavior; prevent another occurrence of the problem; protect and provide support for the victim of the act; and take corrective action for documented systemic problems related to harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

Consequences and remedial measures to address acts or incidents of dating violence at school shall be consistent with the school district's Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy. The factors for determining consequences and remedial measures and examples of consequences and remedial measures are included in Policy and Regulation 5519 – Dating Violence at School and shall be used to address the act or incident as well as serve as remediation, intervention, education, and prevention for all individuals involved. The responses shall be tiered with consideration given to the seriousness and the number of previous occurrences of acts or incidents in which both the victim and aggressor have been involved. Consequences for acts or incidents of dating violence at school may range from admonishment to suspension or expulsion. Retaliation towards the victim of any act or incident of dating violence shall be considered when administering consequences to the aggressor based on the severity of the act or incident. Remedial measures/interventions for acts or incidents of dating violence at school may include, but are not limited to: parent conferences, student counseling (all students involved in the act or incident), peer support groups, corrective instruction or other relevant learning or service experiences, supportive student interventions (Intervention and Referral Services - I&RS), behavioral management plans, and/or alternative placements.

The Board of Education may deny participation in extra-curricular activities, school functions, sports, graduation exercises, or other privileges as disciplinary sanctions when



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designed to maintain the order and integrity of the school environment, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(d).

Any student to be disciplined shall be provided the due process procedures for students and their families as set forth in Policy and Regulation 5600 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.4.

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.9, when a student transfers to a public school district from another public school district, all information in the student's record related to disciplinary actions taken against the student by the school district and any information the school district has obtained pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of Juvenile Information, Penalties for Disclosure, shall be provided to the receiving public school district, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19(a) and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.5.

The Superintendent may be required to submit a report annually to the New Jersey Department of Education on student conduct, including all student suspensions and expulsions, and the implementation of the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy in accordance with the format prescribed by the Commissioner of Education. The Superintendent shall report to the Commissioner of Education each incident of violence, including harassment, intimidation, and bullying, vandalism, and alcohol and other drug offenses, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-4.3, in the school district utilizing the Student Safety Data System (SSDS), pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-5.3.

R 5600 STUDENT DISCIPLINE/CODE OF CONDUCT

A. Purpose

The Student Code of Conduct and this Regulation are established to achieve the following purposes:

- 1. Foster the health, safety, social, and emotional well-being of students;
- 2. Support the establishment and maintenance of civil, safe, secure, supportive, and disciplined school environments conducive to learning;
- 3. Promote achievement of high academic standards;
- 4. Prevent the occurrence of problem behaviors;
- 5. Establish parameters for the intervention and remediation of problem student behaviors at all stages of identification; and
- 6. Establish parameters for school responses to violations of the code of student conduct that take into account, at a minimum, the severity of the offenses, the developmental ages of student offenders and students' histories of inappropriate behaviors in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.9, as appropriate.
- B. Expectations for Academic Achievement, Behavior, and Attendance

All students have a responsibility to comply with State statutes and administrative codes for academic achievement, behavior, and attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8 and 12.1.

C. Behaviors That May Result in Suspension or Expulsion

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, any student who is guilty of continued and willful disobedience, open defiance of the authority of any teacher or person having authority over the student, the habitual use of profanity or of obscene language, or who shall cut, deface or otherwise injure any school property, shall be liable to punishment and to suspension or expulsion from school. Conduct which shall constitute good cause for suspension or expulsion of a student guilty of such conduct shall include, but not be limited to, any of the following:



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- 1. Continued and willful disobedience:
- 2. Open defiance of the authority of any teacher or person, having authority over the student:
- 3. Conduct of such character as to constitute a continuing danger to the physical well-being of other students;
- 4. Physical assault upon another student;
- 5. Taking, or attempting to take, personal property or money from another student, or from the student's presence, by means of force or fear;
- 6. Willfully causing, or attempting to cause, substantial damage to school property;
- 7. Participation in an unauthorized occupancy by any group of students or others of any part of any school or other building owned by any school district, and failure to leave such school or other facility promptly after having been directed to do so by the Principal or other person then in charge of such building or facility;
- 8. Incitement which is intended to and does result in unauthorized occupation by any group of students or others of any part of a school or other facility owned by any school district;
- 9. Incitement which is intended to and does result in truancy by other students;
- 10. Knowing possession or knowing consumption without legal authority of alcoholic beverages or controlled dangerous substances on school premises, or being under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled dangerous substances while on school premises; and
- 11. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

Students shall also be suspended from school for assault upon a school staff member in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2.1 and 2.2.

D. Students' Rights



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Students subject to the consequences of the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation shall be informed of their rights, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)3.i. through vii., that include:

- 1. Advance notice of behaviors that will result in suspensions and expulsions that have been identified under authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2;
- 2. Education that supports students' development into productive citizens;
- 3. Attendance in safe and secure school environments;
- 4. Attendance at school irrespective of students' marriage, pregnancy, or parenthood;
- 5. Due process and appeal procedures, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3-1.3 through 1.17, N.J.A.C. 6A:4 and, where applicable, N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.7 and 2.8, and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 through 7.5;
- 6. Parent notification consistent with the policies and procedures established pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.2(b)3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1 through 7.8; and
- 7. Protections pursuant to 20 U.S.C. § 1232g, Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act; 34 CFR Part 99, Family Educational Rights and Privacy; 20 U.S.C. § 1232h, Protection of Pupil Rights; 34 CFR Part 98, Student Rights in Research, Experimental Programs and Testing; P.L. 104-191, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act; 45 CFR Part 160, General Administrative Requirements; 20 U.S.C. § 7165, Transfer of school disciplinary records; 42 CFR Part 2, Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records; N.J.S.A. 18A:40A-7.1, Confidentiality of certain information provided by pupils, exceptions; N.J.A.C. 6A:16-3.2, Confidentiality of student alcohol and other drug information; N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19, Pupil records, creation, maintenance and retention, security and access, regulations, nonliability; N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of juvenile information, penalties for disclosure; N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7, Student Records; N.J.A.C. 6A:14-2.9, Student records, as well as other existing Federal and State laws and rules pertaining to student protections.
- E. Comprehensive Behavioral Supports



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Below are behavioral supports that promote positive student development and the students' abilities to fulfill the behavioral expectations established by the Board. These behavioral supports may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Positive Reinforcement for Good Conduct and Academic Success
- 2. Supportive Interventions and Referral Services

A student may be referred to the school's Intervention and Referral Services Team in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-8.1 and 8.2 and Policy and Regulation 2417.

3. Remediation of Problem Behavior

The following actions may be taken to remediate problem behavior. These actions will take into account the behavior's nature, the students' developmental ages, and the students' histories of problem behaviors and performance.

a. Restitution and Restoration

- (1) A student may be required to make restitution for any loss resulting from the student's conduct; or
- (2) A student may be required, at the discretion of the school district and when appropriate, to restore to its former condition any damaged or defaced property resulting from the student's conduct.

b. Counseling

- (1) A student may be required to consult with school counselors or Child Study Team members.
- (2) The counselor will explain why the student's conduct is unacceptable to the school and damaging to the student, what the consequences of continued misconduct are likely to be, and appropriate alternative behaviors.
- (3) The counselor may refer the student, as appropriate, for additional counseling, evaluation, intervention, treatment, or therapy. Referrals may be made to the Child Study Team,



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the school's Intervention and Referral Services Team, a public or private social agency, a legal agency, or any other referral service that may assist the student.

c. Parent Conferences

(1) Students may be required to attend a meeting with their parent and appropriate school staff members to discuss the causes of the student's behavior, possible remediation, potential disciplinary measures, and alternative conduct.

d. Alternate Educational Program

(1) Students may be assigned to an alternate educational program as recommended by the student's school counselor, classroom teacher, Child Study Team, and/or other school staff member.

4. Students with Disabilities

For students with disabilities, the remedial measures and behavioral interventions and supports shall be determined and provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

F. School Responses to Violations of Behavioral Expectations

- 1. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(c)5, the Student Code of Conduct shall include a description of school responses to violations of behavioral expectations established by the Board of Education that, at a minimum are graded according to the severity of the offenses, and consider the developmental ages of the student offenders and their histories of inappropriate behavior that shall:
 - a. Include a continuum of actions designed to remediate and, where necessary or required by law, to impose sanctions;
 - b. Be consistent with other responses, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-5.5;
 - c. Provide for equitable application of the Code of Student Conduct without regard to race; color; religion; ancestry; national origin;



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nationality; sex; gender; sexual orientation; gender identity or expression; marital, domestic-partnership, or civil union; mental, physical, or sensory disability; or any other distinguishing characteristic, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et seq. and

d. Be consistent with provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:6-1, Corporal Punishment of Students.

G. Description of School Responses

School responses to violations of behavioral expectations are listed below:

- 1. Admonishment/Reprimand
 - a. A school staff member in authority may admonish or reprimand a student's unacceptable conduct and warn the student that additional misconduct may warrant a more severe penalty.
- 2. Temporary Removal from Classroom
 - a. The classroom teacher may direct the student report to the office of the administrator in charge of student discipline.
 - b. The teacher will complete a form that indicates the student's name and the conduct that has caused the student's removal from the teacher's room.
 - c. The administrator in charge of discipline will interview the student and determine which, if any, additional consequences shall be imposed.
- 3. Meeting with School Administration and Parent
 - a. The student's parent may be required to attend a meeting with the Principal or designee and the student to discuss the student's conduct and to ensure the parent and the student understand school rules and expectations.
- 4. Deprivation of Privileges



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- a. Students may be deprived privileges as disciplinary sanctions when designed to maintain the order and integrity of the school environment. These privileges may include, but are not limited to:
 - (1) Moving freely about the school building;
 - (2) Participation in co-curricular or inter/intrascholastic activities;
 - (3) Attendance at a school-related social or sports activity;
 - (4) Participation in a graduation ceremony;
 - (5) Transportation to and from school on a school bus; or
 - (6) Any other privilege the Building Principal or designee determines may be appropriate and consistent with Policy and Regulation 5600 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1 et seq.

5. Detention

- a. A student may be required to report before or after the school day to detention. This detention may be assigned by the teacher or the Principal or designee.
- b. Transportation to detention before school or from detention after school will be the responsibility of the parent.
- c. A student may be excused from detention only for an unavoidable commitment previously made; any such excused detention must be made up on another day.

6. Grade Adjustment

- a. A student who has cheated on a test or assignment, plagiarized material, falsified sources, refused to submit assignments, or otherwise indulged in academic dishonesty or negligence may suffer a reduced grade by virtue of the disqualified work. In no other instance may a student's grade be lowered as a direct penalty for misconduct.
- 7. In-school Suspension



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- a. If the school operates an in-school suspension program, a student may be removed from his/her regular classes and required to report to the in-school suspension program.
- b. In-school suspension will not be imposed without the due process procedures set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610.

8. Suspension from School

- a. A student may be denied the right to attend school for a period of time pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.2 and 6A:16-7.3, and Policy 5610.
- b. Suspension from school will not be imposed without the due process procedures set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610.

9. Expulsion

- a. The Board may expel a general education student from school, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.4, and Policy 5620.
- b. Expulsion is an extremely serious disciplinary measure and will not be imposed without the due process set forth in Policy and Regulation 5610 and Policy 5620.

H. Chart of Discipline

- 1. A Chart of Student Discipline listing school responses to violations of behavioral expectations shall be reviewed by the Board and included on each school's website.
- 2. The school responses to violations of behavioral expectations that are subject to student discipline including suspension or expulsion pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 outlined in a Chart of Student Discipline shall be consistent with the Board's policies and regulations/procedures on attendance, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6 and harassment, intimidation, and bullying, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7.



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- 3. The Principal or designee will maintain a list of community-based health and social service provider agencies available to support a student and a student's family, as appropriate, and a list of legal resources available to serve the community.
- 4. The Board of Education may deny participation in extra-curricular activities, school functions, sports, graduation exercises, or other privileges as disciplinary sanctions when designed to maintain the order and integrity of the school environment.
- 5. Nothing in Policy and Regulation 5600 shall prevent the school administration from imposing a consequence for unacceptable student conduct not listed or included in a Chart of Student Discipline.
- I. Student Conduct Away from School Grounds
 - 1. The Building Principal or designee has the right to impose a consequence on a student for conduct away from school grounds that is consistent with the Board's Code of Student Conduct, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1.
 - a. This authority shall be exercised only when it is reasonably necessary for the student's physical or emotional safety, security, and well-being or for reasons relating to the safety, security, and well-being of other students, staff, or school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:25-2 and 18A:37-2.
 - b. This authority shall be exercised only when the conduct that is the subject of the proposed consequence materially and substantially interferes with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school.
 - c. Consequences for conduct away from school grounds shall be handled in accordance with the Board approved Code of Student Conduct, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1, Policy and Regulation 5600, and as appropriate, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7-2, 7.3, or 7.4.
 - 2. School authorities shall respond to harassment, intimidation, or bullying that occurs off school grounds, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14 and 15.3 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-1.3, 7.1, and 7.7.
- J. School Bus Conduct



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Violations of the rules regarding student conduct on school buses will be handled as follows:

- 1. The bus driver will report unacceptable conduct to the Principal of the school in which the student is enrolled by submission of a completed written report that includes the name of the student, the school, and the student's conduct.
- 2. The Principal or designee will investigate the matter, which may include meeting with the bus driver, bus aide, other students on the school bus, and the student who was reported by the bus driver.
- 3. The parent will be notified of the student's reported conduct.
- 4. The Principal or designee will make a determination if the student violated behavioral expectations and the discipline to be administered in accordance with the Code of Student Conduct.
- 5. If it is determined the misconduct is severe, the student may be suspended from the bus pending a conference with the parent.

K. Students with Disabilities

For students with disabilities, subject to Individualized Education Programs in accordance with 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., the Individuals with Disabilities Educational Improvement Act, N.J.A.C 6A:14, and accommodation plans under 29 U.S.C. §§ 794 and 705(20), student discipline and the Code of Student Conduct shall be implemented in accordance with the components of the applicable plans.

L. Records

- 1. Instances of student discipline will be recorded in the student's file in strict compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.1 et seq. and Policy and Regulation 8330.
- 2. When a student transfers to a public school district from another public school district, all information in the student's record related to disciplinary actions taken against the student by the school district and any information the school district has obtained pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:4A-60, Disclosure of Juvenile Information; Penalties for Disclosure, shall be provided to the



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receiving public school district, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19(a), and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.5.

- a. The record shall be provided within two weeks of the date that the student enrolls in the receiving district.
- b. Written consent of the parent or adult student shall not be required as a condition of the record transfer; however, written notice of the transfer shall be provided to the parent or the adult student.
- 3. When a student transfers to a private school, which includes all sectarian or nonsectarian, nonprofit, institutional day, or residential schools that provide education for students placed by their parents and that are controlled by other than public authority, all student disciplinary records with respect to suspensions or expulsions, shall be provided by the public school district of residence to the private school upon written request from the private school, in the same manner the records would be provided to a public school, pursuant to 20 U.S.C. § 6301, Title IV § 4155 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.
- 4. The Board shall not use a student's past offenses on record to discriminate against the student.
- 5. All student disciplinary records pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7 shall conform with the requirements set forth in N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.8(d).

M. Annual Review

The Superintendent will designate a school staff member to coordinate an annual review and update of Policy and Regulation 5600. The Superintendent's designee will:

- 1. Compile an annual summary report of violations of the student behavioral expectations and the associated school responses to the violations in the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.
- 2. Convene a Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Committee comprised of parents, students, and community members that represent the composition of the district's schools and community to review the annual summary



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report and to develop recommendations, if any, to improve and update the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.

- 3. The Superintendent's designee shall submit the Committee's recommendations, if any, to improve or update the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation.
- 4. The Superintendent will review the Committee's report with school administrators and will determine if the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation should be updated.
- 5. The Superintendent will recommend to the Board revisions to the Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy, if needed.

N. Policy and Regulation Publication and Distribution

The Student Discipline/Code of Conduct Policy and Regulation 5600, including the Chart of Student Discipline shall be available on each school's website for all school staff, students, and parents. Principals will ensure these documents are made available to all students on or before the first day of each school year and to transferring students on the first day of their enrollment in this district.

Public Information

The success of the school system is dependent upon the cooperation and participation of many people. The Board believes that the advancement of education is served when the community has confidence in the school system, and that such confidence is grounded in an understanding of the Board's purposes and an awareness of the school's programs and facilities.

Any position statement of the Board shall be approved by the Board at a regular meeting and made a part of the official minutes.

Board of Education Communications Committee

The Board recognizes the need for maximum Board-school-community interaction relating to the policy and operation of the Randolph schools. In addition to utilizing the appropriate media to keep the public informed, the Board solicits the views of individuals and organizations on present and future educational programs and processes.

The Board Communications Committee will establish a regular meeting schedule and encourage the public to inquire, learn about, and express a continuing interest in the operation of the schools. The committee will keep the Board apprised of questions, comments and suggestions which are expressed by residents of the community.

In support of this policy, the Board shall utilize appropriate media through which the purposes, values, and needs of the schools may be communicated and shall assist representatives of such media in presenting a true picture of the school system.

The Board and the Superintendent shall follow a continuing program of information designed to acquaint the citizens of the community and the public with the achievements and the needs of the schools. For this purpose, the Director of Communications and Digital Media shall be responsible for:

- 1. New releases and the publication of education reports; and
- 2. The photographing of school activities for publication.



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3. The District website and social media accounts.

In order to coordinate the dissemination of student and staff information, staff members will submit articles slated for publication to the Building Principal, supervisor or the Director of Communications and Digital Media.

The Superintendent prior to release to the media shall approve all press releases on district programs or procedures representing the official position of this district by any of its employees.

The President of the Board of Education prior to release must approve official Board press releases representing the Board's position.

9541.01 edTPA Guidelines for District Employees

District employees pursuing certification through an alternate route may be required to fulfill all requirements of edTPA.

edTPA is a performance-based, subject-specific assessment and support system used by teacher preparation programs through the United States to emphasize, measure and support the skills and knowledge that all teachers need in the classroom. Teacher candidates are required to submit unedited video recordings of themselves at work in a real classroom as part of a portfolio that is scored by a third party.

The Board of Education believes students and/or school staff members should not be subject to having a video or audio recording of any staff or student for any purpose without the consent of the student, the student's parents and/or the school staff member. In addition to protecting the privacy rights of students and school staff members, the Board recognizes such recording can be disruptive to the educational program. Therefore, the Board of Education adopts this Policy regarding staff member use of electronic recording devices. For the purpose of this Policy, a staff member will be defined as a certificated teacher or administrator, employed by the district that are required, during their second year of the Provisional Teacher Program to capture and submit a video in order for their standard certificate to be issued by the New Jersey Department of Education.

"Electronic communication and recording devices (ECRD)" includes any device with the capability to audio or video record or is capable of receiving or transmitting any type of communication between persons. An ECRD includes, but is not limited to, cameras, cellular and wireless telephones, pagers/beepers, laptop computers, electronic readers, personal digital assistants (PDSs), two-way radios, portable fax machines, video broadcasting devices, and any device that allows a person to record and/or transmit, on either a real time or delayed basis, sound, video or still images, text, or other visual information.

Parents of students and adults to be videotaped in the class must receive a notification and permission form from the building Principal prior to the video being produced.

A staff member shall secure permission from parents/guardians for students and from adults who appear in the video recording to use an ECRD to fulfill their edTPA requirement and obtain their standard certification from the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE). The staff member must have been issued a Certificate of Eligibility from the NJDOE and be in their second year of a tenure track position to make a request to fulfill the edTPA requirement.



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The Board understands that the video will then be submitted through the edTPA system to be evaluated by an external group. Once the video has been submitted to the edTPA system, their privacy and security policies and procedures will be in place regarding future use of the video content.

The Board will not provide payment or reimbursement for any fees associated with the edTPA program.
