Policy Committee Minutes November 3, 2008 9:00 – 10:20 a.m.

Principal Carol Strowbridge and Vice Principal Lee Hackney were present to address *R5515* - *Student Parking*, a proposed regulation for the high school. They discussed in depth the proposed procedures, practices and answered questions from the committee. Criteria of the existing policy *5515* – *Student Parking* was also discussed. Both the student and at least one parent must complete the recommended drivers programs in order to be considered for the parking permit. Currently, the Driver Safety Program is included in the tenth grade of Driver Education curriculum. Students whose parent / guardian complete the Alive at 25 program, have a valid driver's license, and insurance protection are eligible to enter into the lottery.

As outlined in the handout provided, parking permits are assigned according to the following criteria:

- 1. Grade twelve students in a Challenger of Option II program will be issued a parking space providing they pay the fee. These students leave school early to attend classes at the CCM or report to a part-time job.
- 2. Grade twelve students who voluntarily agree to car pool and share a parking space will receive a parking space and will not enter the lottery system. Students who car pool will be assigned a fee of \$17.50 each, dividing the \$35.00 fee to the parking space.
- 3. Grade twelve students with complete permit applications will enter the parking lottery. The lottery operates as follows:
 - a. Applications are selected at random by student council leaders.
 - b. This process is witnessed by Mr. Kazaba and a vice principal.
 - c. The number of students selected to receive parking spaces is based upon the number of available spaces.

Parking privilege rules were also discussed. A handout of the procedures and practices was distributed to the attendees of the meeting.
